#### **Conference Volunteers Needed**

## MAFA Reps Groups.io Info

To foster communication among guilds, we've created a <u>Groups.io</u> group just for member guilds' MAFA Reps, officers, and program folks. After the Reps' Meeting, you will receive an invitation to join the group "mafareps". If you already have a Groups.io log-in, feel free to use that, and search for the group "mafareps". If not, you may register with any email and password you choose.

Groups.io is a new online groups service, a lot like the old Yahoo groups, but with more features, and better support. There is a message board, where you can post or reply to messages online or by email, and you can set messages to individual or digest. We have also created sub-groups for topics on 'Guild Admin' and 'Programs & Workshops,' so feel free to start a specific discussion there. And if you want to communicate with just a few people, start a 'Chat.' We hope you will also post your guild events on the 'Calendar.'

Be sure to check out the 'Database' tab, where you will find the 'Programs & Workshops' database, which is in response to those of you who have asked for a resource for program and workshop suggestions, contact info for instructors, and comments on programs. Group members may add guild events directly to the database, or fill out a Program/Workshop Info Form, and a moderator will enter your programs in the database.
